- Coordinates the architectural design with all other design disciplines to provide a complete comprehensive quality end product.
- Prepares all designs, amendments, and modifications using state-of-the-art computer-aided design and drafting (CADD) technology.

- Bachelor's Degree in Architecture or related field
- Familiarity/Ability to use SPECSINTACT, Unified Facilities Criteria, AutoCAD, GIS, MS Project, Primavera, MicroStation, Micro Computer Aided Cost Estimation System (MCACES).
- Knowledge of Fire Safety/Fire Code NFPA, IBC, Unified Facilities Criteria (UFC)
- Security Clearance or Ability to Obtain a Secret Clearance.
